Mask/Facial Coverings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be required to wear masks during the day UNLESS social distancing of 6 feet can be accomplished in the classroom, you are eating, or you are participating in a physical activity "If you move, you mask" – Masks will be required when arriving to school, during passing periods, while moving around the classroom, visiting the teacher's desk, working in groups, etc. Masks will be required while riding the bus 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Exemption from wearing masks will only be accepted from a Doctor Failure to comply will result in students being transitioned to remote learning
Transportation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bus drivers will be taking student temperatures during morning pick up A Parent/Guardian of students 6th grade or younger will be required to be at the bus stop with their student during AM pick up Masks will be required Hand sanitizer will be available 2 students per seat No switching buses. Students will not be allowed to ride a bus different from what they normally do (i.e. spending the night at a friend's house) Buses will unload and load on the EAST parking lot at each building's main entrance Buses will be cleaned and sanitized after both the morning and afternoon routes 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students running a temperature will not be allowed to ride the bus
Drop off/Pick Up	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Middle school students will need to be dropped off and picked up at the main entrance on the east side. 	
Morning Arrival Procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Exterior doors will not be unlocked until 7:20 each morning Students are to enter through the east main entrance of the MS and report directly to their Teacher Advisory classroom 	
Temperature Checks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bus drivers will check student temperatures during pick up Students being dropped off will have their temperature checked as they enter the building 	
Breakfast Procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Breakfast will be delivered to advisory classrooms from 7:30-7:50 Students will eat breakfast in their rooms 	



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Lunch Procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will be dismissed on a staggered schedule• Lunch items will be “grab and go”• Condiments will be pre-packed• No drink stations• 4 students per table/2 per booth• No outside lunch guests	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do not move chairs• Parents are discouraged from bringing in outside food
Passing Periods	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No lockers• Students will be allowed to carry a backpack from class to class• Staggered release to aid in hallway congestion• No Restroom stop• No Water Fountains	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will be allowed to use the restrooms during class• Bottle filling stations will be available. Students are encouraged to bring water bottles
Classroom Mitigation Procedures	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Assigned seats facing the same direction• Doors propped open• Teacher will spray desks as students enter, students will wipe down• Students will “gel in, gel out” of classrooms• Classrooms will be cleaned and hard surfaces disinfected each night	
Parents/Guests	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No visitors will be allowed in the building without an appointment• The number of visitors to the schools, including the offices, will be limited to only those necessary for school business.• Parents will be restricted to the main office• Parents and visitors will be required to wear masks and may have to answer health screening questions before entering	
Students Who Are Feeling or Become Ill	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students who are ill or experiencing COVID-related symptoms should not report to school and should notify the school.• If students become ill after arriving at school, students will be isolated from others (Masks may be used if needed in efforts to isolate) and sent home immediately. Parents should make arrangements to pick up students from the health office as soon as possible to avoid prolonged exposure.• Students who exhibit symptoms of COVID 19 should contact their health provider for additional instructions.	



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Unless otherwise cleared to return to school by a doctor, the student must remain at home for 10 days AND until he or she is symptom free for 72 hours without the use of fever-reducing or other symptom-altering medicines. Whichever criteria is longer.• Students who have been tested and are awaiting results should remain isolated at home until the results are received.	
Protocols for Students or Staff Who Test Positive	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Cherokee County Health Department (CCHD) will provide official notification to the district of any positive COVID-19 case.• The CCHD will provide guidance on the level of concern, potential for classroom or school closure, and length of closure.• The CCHD will be responsible for and conduct contact tracing of individuals who may be at-risk of exposure to the virus, and will be in contact with those individuals regarding recommended next steps.• The district will work closely with the CCHD investigating and enforcing cases requiring isolation for individuals who have or are believed to be high risk for testing positive for COVID-19.• The district will work closely with the CCHD investigating and enforcing cases requiring quarantine of those individuals considered a "contact" of someone who has or is believed to be high risk for testing positive for COVID-19.	
Communication Protocol for Students or Staff Who Test Positive	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• School officials will send information to parents and staff within 24 hours of the district's notification regarding known positive cases of students and staff. The CCHD will conduct contact tracing and follow-up with impacted individuals.
